HIGHLAND PREP WEST ACADEMICS

Highland Prep West's academic program operates on a block schedule consisting of four, 90 minute classes per day. Students earn two credits per quarter or eight credits per school year. Highland Prep West requires students to complete 28 credits for graduation.

4 English credits, 3 Science credits, 3 Social Studies credits, 2 Foreign Language credits,

3 College Engineering credits, 1 Fine Arts credit, 1 Physical Education credit, and 7 Elective credits.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are college-level courses offered in high school that follow a nationally recognized curriculum developed by College Board. Students also have the opportunity to earn college credit by scoring well on the corresponding AP exam.

GRADING SCALE

The following grading scale has been established:

90-100 = A, 80-89 = B, 70-79 = C, 60-69 = D, 0-59 = F

Grade Point Average (GPA)

Unweighted GPA: The cumulative unweighted grade point average includes all general courses taken for credit at HPW. It is calculated for high school graduations purposes as follows:

A = 4.00 grade pts, B = 3.00 grade pts,
C = 2.00 grade points, D = 1.00 grade pts, and
F = 0.00 grade points

Weighted GPA: The cumulative weighted grade point average includes additional weight for Honors and AP courses taken for credit at HPW. It is calculated for high school graduation as follows:

A = 5.00 grade pts, B = 4.00 grade pts,
C = 3.00 grade points, D = 1.00 grade pts, and
F = 0.00 grade points

ENGINEERING

Highland Prep offers nine college engineering credits in partnership with Project Lead the Way. Engineering classes are college classes and students are required to earn at least three credits of college engineering.

DUAL ENROLLMENT
